




Doctorate at ETH Zurich – some facts:


4537 active doctoral students as of today (27 August 2024)

- 36% female
- 25% Swiss citizens




- 80% at ETH

Duration of a doctorate at ETH Zurich











Main steps towards your doctorate

- (Probationary period report, after 8-10 weeks)
- Choice of (at least one) second advisor
- Writing the doctoral plan
- Aptitude colloquium (12 months after start date of your doctorate)
- Gathering ECTS points
- Likely involvement in teaching activities
- Annual progress reports and status conversations (once a year after the aptitude colloquium has been passed)
- Doctoral exam / handing in of deposit copies of thesis / doctoral awards ceremony



Doctorate at ETH Zurich: Employment and salary

- Most doctoral students are ETH employees
- Important: employment and enrolment are distinct administrative aspects: all matters concerning your working contract have to be discussed with human resources.
- A doctorate at ETH is based on scientific merit, not on the number of hours you spend in the office/laboratory or the numbers of years you have been a doctoral student
- A doctorate is an investment in your own career

Yearly milestones

First year:

- Doctoral plan needs to be approved by your doctoral thesis supervisor and second advisor
- Presentation of your first results and doctoral plan at the aptitude colloquium (after 12 months)
- Passing the aptitude colloquium is the end of your probation period, afterwards you are a "real" doctoral student

Subsequent years:

- Report annually to your supervisor and co-advisor(s) on your progress in the annual status conversations
- Obtain written feedback by the supervisor and co-advisor(s) and decide on the achievements for the coming year

ECTS credits for doctoral students

- All doctoral students must complete a regular doctoral studies program of 12 ECTS credits in courses and conferences.
- There is one mandatory course on ethics and good scientific practice: 1 ECTS.
- Admission to the doctorate may be subject to the requirement of an extended doctoral studies program. When evaluating your dossier for admission, the department may request an additional course program of up to 30 ECTS credits to fill any gaps in your knowledge or if it considers that your qualifications are not equivalent to an ETH Master's degree.

Doctoral thesis and examination/defense

- Monographic or cumulative style of your doctoral thesis (discussion with supervisor)
 - e.g. 2-3 scientific papers
- Closed or public examination/defense (depending on department) of minimum our hour
